P.O.W.E.R Project

- » 103 Parents Enrolled
- **>> 56** Parents assisted with obtaining employment
- » 11 Parents attended job readiness training
- **>> 54** Parents attend support groups for a total of **602** hours provided

The primary focus of Crisis Prevention is to identify needs affecting local families and develop a plan for connecting the two. Key services offered to children and families include the Circle of Parents parent support group, the First Birthday Project and P.O.W.E.R Project.

- **Circle of Parents** meets monthly to provide children and families opportunities for education and social interaction. Parents assist with planning and selection of educational topics.
- The First Birthday Project is a safe sleep program offered to low-income families in Buchanan, DeKalb, and Grundy Counties. Through two home visits, participating families will learn and practice safe sleep techniques, have a portable crib delivered and set-up in their home, and receive follow-up services.
- P.O.W.E.R is an employment assistance program for individuals who owe child support and live or work in Andrew, Buchanan, Clinton, or DeKalb Counties. P.O.W.E.R stands for Providing Opportunities for Work, Education, and Responsibility.
- **The Youth Alliance** is invested in child abuse prevention education and awareness and is constantly striving to keep kids and families safe.



Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Revenues

The St. Joseph Youth alliance has supported youth and their families by bringing in more than \$31 million in resources for over 28 years to address crisis prevention, substance abuse prevention, early childhood development, youth employment/mentoring, and youth asset development. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, program and cash revenues totaled \$1,260,663. Volunteers logged 811 hours valued at \$17,764. In-kind donations totaled \$111,183. Overall, the Youth Alliance's total contributed resources for the FY 18-19 were valued at \$1,389,810.
